First, we would like to introduce you to the 2012 Brooke Forbes Legacy Fund Intern, Satvir Sahota.

This year, MOSAIC – an organization serving immigrants -- received the funds, chose the participant and arranged an



internship with RedFM in Surrey. RedFM is the most popular radio station in BC that broadcasts in Punjabi.

Satvir immigrated from India with his mother and brother seven years ago at the age of ten. His mother has been raising her two sons with the support of the extended family. They live in the basement suite of his uncle.

Satvir has assisted on remote broadcasts and learned to operate the board for studio-based programming.
