

Dear Friends of Brooke,

We're writing to you, as we usually do at this time of year, to wish you the best of the season and to let you know where your donations to the Legacy Fund are going in 2013-2014.

The Advisory Committee has decided to work again with the Vancouver-based immigrant serving organization, MOSAIC. We will sponsor an intern who will learn about radio through a partnership MOSAIC plans to develop with Vancouver Co-operative Radio. We thought this would be a good fit since Brooke got her start in the medium at Co-op Radio and many members of the Vancouver Friends of Brooke Chapter first met her there.

MOSAIC has received \$1,759 from the Fund to offer the internship through its NuYu Popular Theatre Project.

The picture is of a NuYu. Group at MOSAIC. The participants are refugee and immigrant youth who used games and theatre exercises to create scenes or plays from the real stories of their lives. Theatre is a way for them to practice making the positive changes they want in their lives. Participants show the plays they create to audiences at public interactive theatre forums. That results in the community being part of conversations about issues they face, and possible solutions. There are many stories generated by the NuYu groups that would make great radio!
